As chair of the Greater Vancouver Mental Health Service Society, I would like to bring your attention to the allocation of units for development of new residential resources for individuals who have a mental illness.

Only 89 units have been allocated for mental health for the whole of B.C. Vancouver and Richmond have been allocated 39 units. The whole of the Fraser Valley/North Shore region has been allocated only 14 units.

These allocations are completely inadequate given the need for housing for individuals who have a mental illness.

It is a simple fact that we cannot provide care for our clients in the community unless they are adequately housed. Lack of housing means that people with a serious mental illness will be less likely to stay in treatment, they will experience the increased symptoms of illness and their ability to cope in the community will deteriorate.

Our organization and City Council will face increasing concern and diminishing public support for mentally ill people in the community who are not adequately housed and, as a consequence, not in treatment.

The inadequate allocation of units has made it impossible for us to proceed with the development of much needed facilities in the current year. Proposals that we currently have from interested organizations cover the whole range of essential housing options:

apartment units	114	units
hotel specialized residential	30	units
care facilities	60	units
emergency beds:		
Lookout	25	units
Triage replacement	28	units

Each of these proposals is both needed and appropriate.

I would like to request that City Council give consideration to making strong representation to the senior levels of government on the need for many more units for development of new housing.

I would also like to urge Council to continue to acquire building sites for projects like those listed above. While we may not be able to proceed with these projects this year, they remain a high priority and, if units are allocated will proceed next year.
